On the Road with P.E.O.

Easy skit. Props include a steering wheel, a cardboard car (or two chairs placed next to each other) and a map. Cheat sheet scripts can be placed on the steering wheel and inside the map. Answers to the game do not have to be the same as the ones written below - they are simply examples. We would encourage creativity in answers, perhaps personalizing them to your chapter.

Driver: "Wow, this car drives like a dream...and I'm about to fall asleep!"

Passenger holding map: "Okay, let's play one of our alphabet games where we think of a category and say something that starts with each letter. Can you think of a good category?

Driver: "Well, since our destination is a P.E.O. meeting, let's do things that remind us of P.E.O."

Passenger: "That's a good idea! **A** is for **active**. That's what we call all of us who pay our dues."

Driver: "**B** is for **BILs**, our brothers-in-law!"

Passenger: "C is for Cottey College ... our college."

Driver: "D is for **dimit**. That's a P.E.O. word we used to use. Now we call it **transfer**."

Passenger: "E is for Educational Loan Fund. That's one of our projects."

Driver: "F is for Franc Roads Elliott. She was one of the Founders."

Passenger: "G is for Golden Girl, a 50-year member. We've had several of those in our chapter!"

Driver: "H is for history. P.E.O. was founded in 1869."

Passenger: "I is for International Peace Scholarship."

Driver: "That's another good project! **J** is for **join**. You often hear sisters say that they "joined" P.E.O., but I like to say that I "became" a P.E.O."

Passenger: "**K** is for ... let me see ... **Karla Jo Farmer**. She was the 2009-2010 Kansas State Chapter president. **K** could also be for **keeping** the true meaning of P.E.O. private."

Driver: "L is for **love**. That's one of our virtues."

Passenger: "M is for meetings."

Driver: "N is for **Nominating Committee**. That's a very important committee."

Passenger: "O is for Opening Ode that we sing at the beginning of our meetings."

Driver: "P is for Program for Continuing Education, another one of our projects."

Passenger: "Q is for Chapter Q. It is in Nickerson."

Driver: "R is for **Reciprocity**. That's when a bunch of chapters get together."

Passenger: "S is for a lot of things, but sisters are definitely the most important!"

Driver: "T is for **truth**. That's another one of our virtues."

Passenger: "U is for unity. We have a lot of that with our sisters."

Driver: "V is for Vice President. She's the officer now in charge of balloting."

Passenger: "Yes, and she takes over for the president when she isn't able to be here. W is for the Ways and Means Committee which leads our chapter's fundraising efforts."

Driver: "Another important committee! **X** is for **Chapter X**. It is in Garden City."

Passenger: "Y is for yellow, one of our colors."

Driver: "Z is for ... let's see ... oh, there's a sister named **Sophia Zetmier**. Isn't that a neat name?!

Passenger: "Yes it is. She is one of Kansas' past state presidents. Well, we're here at our P.E.O. meeting now. Let's see if our sisters want to play the game with us. We'll start over here on the left and go through the alphabet again. If you get stuck, we'll help you!" Note: If there are not enough sisters to go through the whole alphabet again, decide whether some sisters are going to have more than one letter, or just say the remaining letters and let sisters call out answers if they think of something.

After everyone else is done playing, the **passenger** says, "Thanks for going with us 'On the Road' with P.E.O.!"
